Children are marginalized as a whole, but some kids, such as those who are female, have disabilities, or come from racial or ethnic minorities experience much more prejudice.

Children who have disabilities have the right to express their opinions freely on all issues that affect them, with consideration for their maturity and age, on an equal footing with other children, and to receive disability- and age-appropriate help in order to exercise that right. Children with physical disabilities or learning challenges have the right to specialized care, education, and training that will enable them to become as self-sufficient as possible and to participate fully in society.
